IB (International Baccalaureate) News

The PYP (Primary Years Program) prepares students to become active, caring, lifelong learners who demonstrate respect for themselves and others and have the capacity to participate in the world around them. It focuses on the development of the whole child as an inquirer, both within and beyond the classroom. The PYP nurtures independent learning skills, encouraging every student to take responsibility for their learning. The program incorporates local and global issues into the curriculum, asking students to look at six related, transdisciplinary themes and to consider the links between them. The themes include: Who We Are, Where We Are in Place and Time, How the World Works, How We Organize Ourselves, How We Express Ourselves, and Sharing the Planet. Each theme lasts four to six weeks. Every classroom K-5 is an IB classroom. If you have any questions about our IB Program, please contact Ms. Leslie, our Heights IB Coordinator.

FOCUS Parent Portal Account

Do you want to have access to your student's grades, assignments and schedules? All you have to do is register for a Focus Parent Portal Account. Instructions can be found on our website: <http://het.leeschools.net>—under the School Updates section. Parents/Guardians have two options to create an account—one requires school verification, the other option does not. If you provide your child's date of birth, student ID number, the email address you have on file with the district **AND** the last 4-digits of your child's Social Security Number (provided the student's SSN is on file with the district), you will have immediate access to your child's information. **NOTE:** If your child's SSN is not on file with the district, or you elect not to provide it, school verification will be required in order to get access to your child's information.
